A Celebration of Seattle's History

The Log House Museum opened on November 13, 1997, the 146th anniversary of the Denny Party landing at Alki. Its mission is to provide a place for discovering and celebrating the history and culture of the Duwamish peninsula. The Museum is housed in an authentically renovated log structure, circa 1903. The Southwest Seattle Historical Society received an Award of Excellence in 1998 from the Washington Museum Association for the restoration of this landmarked historic building.

Video Viewing Area

Visitors can learn about the 1851 Alki Landing and the relationship between the pioneers and Native Americans in the video, *Alki: Birthplace of Seattle*. A video documenting the restoration of the Log House Museum is also available for viewing.

Docent Tours

The Museum offers historically interpreted guided tours to school groups as well as organizations, clubs, etc. Rates vary depending on group size. Please contact the Museum for more detailed information.

Heritage Education Kits for Educators

Education Kits consist of a collection of reproduction maps, photographs, documents, and other artifacts, accompanied by carefully developed lesson plans and other classroom activities. Additionally, a Library Kit containing books and audio and video tapes, augments the Heritage Kit and is also available for classroom use. Call for rental information.

Location & Accessibility

The Museum is located just one block from

the restaurants and waterfront shops of Alki Beach. From I-5 or Hwy. 99, take the West Seattle Bridge and exit onto Admiral Way SW. Follow Admiral Way SW to 61st Avenue SW and turn right. The Museum is just one block north, on the southwest corner of 61st Avenue SW and SW Stevens Street. Street parking is available; Museum visitors may also utilize the Homestead Restaurant parking lot with prior authorization from the Museum. Metro bus lines #56 and #37 offer public transportation. Both Museum and gift shop are wheelchair accessible.

Admission

Admission is by donation. \$2 per adult and \$1 per child is suggested.

Gift Shop

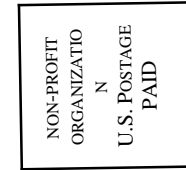
Be sure to visit the gift shop, which offers an assortment of books on regional history, vintage post cards, note cards, T-shirts and other interesting items.
